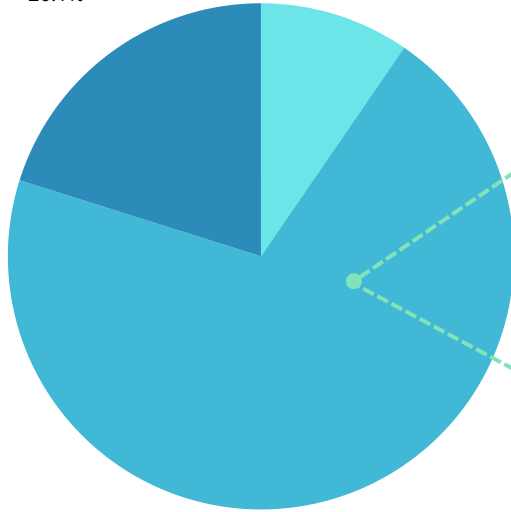

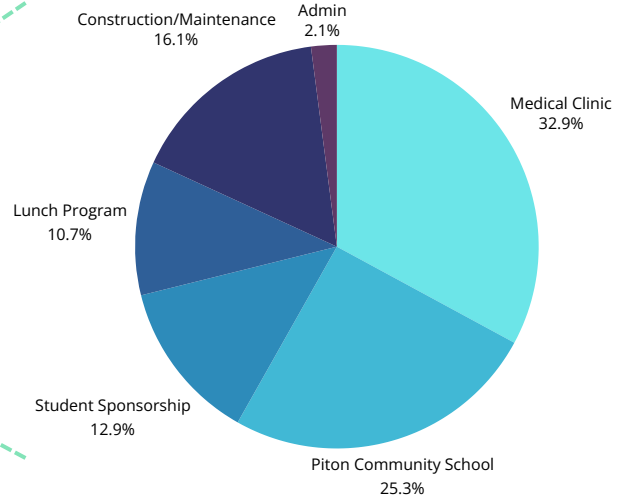

2024 Highlights

- The Student Sponsorship program was launched! An innocent question from a supporter made me realize it was time to revisit this idea. While refugee children fleeing Port-au-Prince with their families are prioritized, all students and the school benefit from this program.
- For the first time ever, the Piton and Piton West villages have a paved road (tire strips) all 3,600 feet up the mountain. Thanks to the generosity of 3 supporters, this project was completed without utilizing our normal budget.
- Aid to Infrastructure became Piton Partnership! The name more closely represents who we are and where our priorities lay. It also translates beautifully to Haitian Creole: **Patenarya Piton**.
- We capped off the year with an unprompted challenge from a generous donor: raise \$25,000 and I'll match you \$25,000. Challenge accepted and - thanks to YOU, dear supporters, we met it! Piton Partnership is starting 2025 off in its most secure financial position yet. Of course, your support is still important to keep us moving forward and improving.
